Herpetology was the specific field of zoology that focused on studying reptiles (such as turtles, tortoises, snakes, lizards, crocodilians, and tuataras) and amphibians (such as frogs, toads, caecilians, salamanders, and newts).

The name was given based on how these creatures move on the ground, as it originates from the Greek term "herpes" which signifies crawling.

Reptiles and amphibians differ in their association with water.

According to the Missouri Department of Conservation, amphibians require water in their environment since they go through their entire life cycle in water. Most amphibians are generally known to deposit their eggs in water, meaning that they would typically spend the initial stage of their life in an aquatic environment.

In contrast, reptiles do not require a permanent presence in water and can either live close

to it or occasionally spend short periods in aquatic environments without depending on them for survival.

The skin is yet another contrasting aspect between these distinct species categories.

Because reptiles are not aquatic creatures and typically favour hotter, arid climates, they commonly possess scaly skin which enables them to adapt and thrive in such conditions.

In contrast, amphibians possess thin and delicate skin which permits them to breathe underwater.

Instead, the majority of amphibians rely on their elongated tongues, which possess a remarkable ability to swiftly extend and retract, allowing them to capture their own food.

Amphibians have the unique characteristic of being able to live solely in freshwater environments, while being unable to endure survival in saltwater. Their unsuitability for residing in saltwater arises from their porous skin, which enables them to respire underwater.

Their skin frequently exhibits a vivid green hue accompanied by brown spots. Albino pacman frogs, resembling a vibrant combination of yellow with scattered orange spots, can also be found.

When fully grown, these frogs consume crickets only twice a week or one complete pinky mouse every week.

Yellow & Black Frog

Formerly identified as *Dendrobates leucomelas* and informally referred to as the bumblebee or the yellow banded poison dart frog, these amphibians are also indigenous to Southern America.

They predominantly inhabit tropical rainforests and humid surroundings, hence requiring a warmer habitat.

If you're searching for a pet that you don't intend to play with but rather want it for decorative purposes, then this is an excellent choice.

The stunning hues they possess are exquisite, and despite their small size, they display remarkable levels of energy.

With an average lifespan of approximately 10 to 15 years, these creatures have the potential to grow up to 1.2 to 2 inches in length.

Regarding these frogs, the only aspect worth mentioning is that while they may appear visually appealing and intriguing, they lack a high level of activity and interest.

Consequently, if you desire a pet that you can interact with, they may not be the most suitable option for you.

The advantage is that their lack of activity enables them to be kept in a small enclosure, so 20 gallons is sufficient.

Asian Toad

The oriental bellied toad is yet another breathtaking amphibian. The amphibians are aptly named as their bellies are brightly colored,

making them easily recognizable with their green skin on the upper and lateral parts, while the underside is strikingly vibrant with shades of orange and yellow.

The arrangement that overlays these vibrant hues adds an extra level of fascination to their appearance, potentially compensating for their small stature of just 2 inches when fully grown.

In order to maintain the required conditions, it will be necessary to keep them in a moist and humid environment, providing a tank or container for water storage.

Frog

Finally, it is worth examining the *Agalychnis callidryas*, commonly referred to as the red-

eyed toad. This arboreal amphibian flourishes in watery, damp environments like the rainforests found in Mexico, Central America, and Columbia.

Similar to the other frogs we have examined, they display vibrant colors. Their red eyes and brightly colored green skin, highlighted by blue and yellow on their sides, are the distinguishing features that help identify a red-eyed toad. You can notice narrow and vertical pupils in the middle of their eyes, making them an ideal choice as a captivating pet. On the other hand, their life expectancy is relatively shorter, typically ranging around five years. Despite their vibrant colors, the red-eyed toad is actually harmless, making it unnecessary for one to be concerned about accidentally poisoning oneself by coming into contact with it. Having said that, similar to many frogs, they are not very comfortable with frequent handling.
